- Outreach Activities


Unstructured Event: the volunteers are responsible for organizing events themselves.

Data Gathered from Participants in the MWS Program Through Surveys


A 10 question survey was administered to past MWS volunteers using Survey Monkey. Questions were asked regarding their experience with the events (structured or unstructured) that took place during their time in the program. The data that was collected is based off of information from 11 respondents.

Structured Events Offer an Excellent Opportunity for Volunteers to Engage in Environmental Stewardship in their Community



7 out of the 11 respondents agreed that structured events put on by the MWS program offer creative opportunities to engage in the community.

7 out of the 11 respondents agreed that structure events put on by the MWS program make it easier to volunteer.
